GENERAL DESCRIPTION (Continued)

streams with small valleys formed by Wasson, Harvey and Murphy Creeks.

The soil is a shallow sandy loam, gravelly on the hillsides, from 12 to 30 inches deep underlaid by a strata of solid sandstone with occasional outcroppings of the same.

The timber consists of Fir, Cedar and Hemlock, Maple and Alder. Most of the evergreens are of second growth, making good piling timber.

The undergrowth is very dense, consisting of Huckleberry, Salmonberry, Vinemaple, Alder, Rhododendron, Chittem, Cherry, Lilac, Manzanita, Salal and Fern and grows profusely on all parts of the township.

There are no indications of minerals and no settler occupying the unsurveyed lands.

The magnetic variation is N.21½°E., with no local attraction noted.
