S.72*E. 13.50 chs. High and rocky.

S.56*E. 12.00 chs. Valley begins to widen out.

S.51*E. 29.00 chs. Valley about 20 chs. wide.

S.80*E. 5.00 chs. To meander post.

Land, 3rd rate except valley 1st
rate. Timber poor fir.

Beginning at the meander post bet. secs. 34 and 35,
North, on true line.

22.11 From cor. on Tp. line to N. side of river.

40.00 Set ¼ sec. cor. a post at foot of hills, from which

A willow, 8 ins. diam., bears N.54½*E., 45 lks. dist.

Land, 1st rate. Mountains steep to the North.
