Meanders in Sec. 35,

S.80\*E. 17.00 chs. (4.00, a house North 80 lks.  
(Land level, 50 lks., creek, 10 lks.  
( wide.

East 18.00 chs. Burned timber.

N.85\*E. 13.50 chs. Burned timber.

S.85½\*E. 16.00 chs. Burned timber.

S.74\*E. 9.50 chs. Hills closes in to river.

S.80\*E. 7.13 chs. To the meander post.

Land, generally 1st rate. No  
timber of importance. Valley  
overflows at very high waters.

August 24, 1874.

In sec. 36,

S.65\*E. 35.20 chs. Set the meander post bet. secs.

36 and sec. 1, from which

A spruce, 12 ins. diam., bears N.32\*E., 48 lks. dist.

A spruce, 20 ins. diam., bears S.68\*E., 519 lks. dist.

Land, a low, narrow bottom. Mountains, abrupt.

Banks marshy. No timber of importance.

Beginning at m.p. bet. secs. 1 and 36 on N. bdy. of the

Tp. and N. bank of river, thence

In sec. 1, T. 22 S., R. 11 W.,

S.68\*E. 30.00 chs. Mountain, steep,

S.38\*E. 33.30 chs. and rocky.

To m. p. bet. secs. 1 and 6 on  
the E. bdy. of the Tp.

Land, 3rd rate. Banks high and  
rocky. Some fir timber along  
side of mountain.

The meander of island in sec. 35,

To post on E. and on point of island,

from m.p. bet. secs. 1 and 2, S. side of river, N.14\*W.

from m.p. bet. secs. 35 and 36, N. side of river, S.74\*W.

Dist. from m.p. bet. secs. 35 and 36, S.74\*W. 9.64 chs.
