As the country ahead has the same characteristics as the last line, namely high abrupt ridge with deep canyons between, being often almost perpendicular cliffs, and covered by fallen timber, and as there are no trees to be blazed, the timber being burnt and mostly down, I run by traverse down to the bottom of a small creek, (named Harvey creek) and thence to the south boundary as follows:

Thence I run W. 16.67 chs. to my townshipline, where I set a sandstone in the ground, for closing cor. to townships 21 S., Ranges 10 & 11 W., 8.25 chs. E. of cor. to Tp. 22 S., R. 10 & 11 W., marked C C with 6 notches on N, E and W edges, and raised a mound of
