CHAINS

stone, 1½ ft. high, 2 ft. base, alongside, pits impracticable.

Land, mountainous. 99.26 chs.

Soil, rocky and 4th rate.

Timber, mostly burnt fir; scattering.

Dense underbrush of salal, huckle and mesquite growth, 99.26 chs.

July 11, 1891.

Portion of South Bdy. of T. 21 S., R. 11 W. same deputy and contract.

Begin at the cor. to Tps. 21 and 22 S., R. 10 & 11 W., which is a stone 6x12x18 ins., notches not any more perceptible, from which

A stump of cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S.2*W., 50 lks. dist. marks visible B T.

An alder, 14 ins. diam., bears N.22*W., 71 lks. dist. marked T 21 S R 11 W S 36 B T.

The other two bearing trees have been destroyed by fire; I marked

A maple, 6 ins. in diam., bears N.30*E., 7 lks. dist. T 22 S R 10 & 11 W C C B T.

Thence I run

West, on S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Va.19*50'E.

Begin steep ascent of E. slope.

4.50	Enter bare cliffs.	
13.10	Top of ridge, bears S.30*W. and N.30*E.	+400
	Begin sharp descent.	
24.50	A canyon, course SW. begin ascent.	-500
31.75	Top of spur, bears N. and S., begin descent.	+120
36.25	A canyon, course S., ascend.	-100
46.50	Top of spur, enter few green firs.	+200
