23.25	A branch, 5 lks. wide course NW.	-160
29.00	Top of spur, bears N. and S.; descend W. slope.	+280
37.25	A canyon, course NE.	-200
40.33	Set a post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face, from which A chittem, 8 ins. diam., bears S.75 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 46 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A cherry, 6 ins. diam., bears N.68*W., 29 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. Ascend NE. slope.

74.50	A canyon, course N.	-75
77.75	Top of spur bears N. and S. begin steep descent of E. slope.	+80
80.66	The cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15. Land, mountainous. 80.66 chs. Soil, gravelly and 3rd rate. Heavily timbered with fir, alder, cedar, maple, chittem, cherry. Dense undergrowth of salmon and thimbleberries, and vinemaples. 80.66 chs.	-120.
