40.00	Set a sandstone, 15x10x6 ins. 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face, from which A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.34 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 36 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.77*E., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
