40.22	Set a sandstone, 12x11x4 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor; marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face; and raised a mound of stone, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high and 2 ft. base alongside; pits impracticable.	+150
55.50	Top of ascent on N. slope of mountain; begin descent.	+150
67.80	A branch, 3 lks. wide, course S.60*W.; begin ascent of SE. slope.	-200
80.44	The cor. of secs. 26 and 27. Land, mountainous. 80.44 chs. Soil, rocky, 4th rate. Scattering timber of burnt fir. Dense undergrowth of salmon, salal, huckle and thimble-berries. 80.44 chs. July 28, 1891.	
	I return to cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, which is a post, 4 ins. sq., badly decayed, marked T 21 S S 10 on NE., R 11 W S 15 on SE., S 16 on SW., S 9 on NW. faces with 3 notches on E. and 4 notches on S. edges, from which A cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears N.60*W., 75 lks. dist. marked T 21 S R 11 W S 9 B T. All other bearing trees are gone. Thence I run East, on random line bet. secs. 10 and 15. Va.19*48'E.	
40.00	Set temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.	
80.72	Intersect N. and S. line 46 lks. S. of cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15. South, 89*40'W. on true line bet. secs. 10 and 15. Va.19*44'E.	
2.25	Steep ascent through 2nd growth fir timber. Top of spur, bears E. and W; descend NW. slope.	+120
