17.50	A branch, course N.30*W., 5 lks. wide, begin ascent of NE. slope.	-300
29.75	Top of dividing ridge, bears S.25*E. and N.25*W., begin descend of W. slope.	+350
40.36	Set a post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.24*E., 11 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.31 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 40 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

43.00	Descend SW. slope.	
47.25	A canyon, course N.60*W.	
49.30	Same canyon, begin ascent of N. slope.	-100
53.40	Top of spur, bears NE. and SW.	+120

62.75	Top of spur, bears N.30*E. and S.30*W., descend NW. slope, covered by small alders and maples.	+120
72.25	A canyon, and branch, 2 lks. wide, course N.; ascend	-250
76.75	Top of spur, bears N. and S. descent.
