	Descend.	
1.50	Enter bottom, bears S.	-80
6.00	Leave bottom, begin ascent of S slope.	
33.00	Begin descent.	
35.80	Foot of hill; enter bottom, overflowed by high tides and freshets.	-60
39.00	Mouth of a wide large gulch from the North.	
39.86	Set a post, 4 ft. long, 5 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face, from which A spruce, 12 ins. diam., bears N.52 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 100 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. An alder, 8 ins. diam., bears N.37 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 140 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. And raised a mound of stone, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, 2 ft. base alongside. The former bearing trees have been destroyed by fire, as a logging road is opened through here. Continue through marsh.	
48.00	Leach's house, bears S., about 600 lks.	
50.20	Otter slough, 60 lks. wide, course SE.	
56.60	Otter slough, 80 lks. wide, course NW.	
57.50	Begin steep ascent.	
62.00	Top of spur, bears N and S.	+120
65.25	Top of spur, bears N and S; begin descent.	
70.25	A canon, course N; begin ascent of E slope.	-70
76.00	Top of spur, bears N and S; begin descent of steep burnt W slope.	+75
79.72	The cor. to secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29. Land, hilly, except 20 chs. level. Soil, gravelly and 3d rate, except 20 chs. alluvial bottom. Scattering timber, fir, alder, maple, cedar. Dense undergrowth of salmon and thimbleberries, young
