	alders and cherries. 58.00 chs.	
	S.0*3'E., bet. secs. 28 and 29.	
	Va.19*46'E.	
	Ascend W slope through burnt timber.	
4.00	Top of ascent, begin descent of steep S slope.	+30
7.25	A canon, course NW; ascend a steep N slope.	-100
9.00	Change to ascent of NW slope; enter green timber.	+120
12.75	A gulch, course W; begin steep ascent.	-50
21.00	Leave green timber.	
24.00	Top of spur, bears N and S.	
29.50	Top of ascent; a small flat, covered by green and dead cherries, dividing ridge. East is the head of gulch to Leach's house; begin descent.	+250
39.00	Change to descent of W slope.	
40.00	A fir, 48 ins. diam., which I marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on E side ( a bluff prevents the W side) for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. from which A fir; 36 ins. diam., bears S.3*E., 510 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ B T. No tree within limits in sec. 29. Descend W slope through dead cherries.	-80
45.00	Enter green fir timber.	
55.25	Foot of mountain, enter bottom bears E and W.	-200
57.60	A branch, 6 lks. wide, course W.	
58.00	Set a post, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked W C S 28 on E and S 29 on W side, from which A treble maple, 24 ins. diam., bears S.84*E., 38 lks. dist., marked W C S 28 B T. A vine maple, 5 ins. diam., bears N.73*W., 22 lks. dist., marked W C S 29 B T. ( I done this, as the settlers will fire the hillsides and so destroy all marks, while these in the bottoms will remain.)
