19.50	A branch, 3 lks. wide, course NW. Begin steep ascent.	-80
34.20	Dividing ridge, bears E and W. Begin descent of NW slope.	+240
40.00	Set a post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 4 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, marked T 21 S S 20 on NE., R 11 W S 29 on SE., S 30 on SW., S 19 on NW face, with 5 notches on E and 2 notches on S edges, from which A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N.21*E., 5 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W S 20 B T. A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S.32*E., 9 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W S 29 B T. A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears S.35*W., 5 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W S 30 B T. An alder, 9 ins. diam., bears N.89 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 4 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W S 19 B T. Land, mountainous. 40.00 chs. Soil, gravelly and 3d rate. Heavily timbered with fir, spruce, cedar, hemlock, alder, maple, cherry. Dense undergrowth of salmon, salal and thimbleberries, vine maple, young firs. 40.00 chs.	-120
