

## Subdivisions of T. 21 S., R. 11 W.

## CHAINS

- 64.70 A dead fir, 18 ins. diam., which I marked with 2 notches on N and S sides, begin ascent of a rocky mountain slope.
- 69.48 Intersect S bdy. of sec. 27, 16.95 chs. W of cor. to secs. 26 and 27.
- Set a sandstone, 14x8x5 ins. 10 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. to secs. 34 and 35, marked C C with 1 notch on S and 2 notches on E edges, and raised a mound of stone, 1½ ft. high and 2 ft. base alongside; pits impracticable.
- Land, mountainous. 69.48 chs.
- Soil, stony and 4th rate.
- Scattering timber of fir, nearly all burnt, young fir springing up now in places.
- Dense undergrowth of salmon, salal, thimble and mesquite berries, young growth of small firs. 69.48 chs.
- August 14, 1891.
- 
- From the meander post on right bank of Umpqua river, to fractional secs. 33 and 34, which is a fir, 24 ins. diam., marked M C on S side, T 21 S S 34 on E., R 11 W S 33 on W side.
- Thence I run
- N.0\*2'W., bet. secs. 33 and 34.
- Va.19\*52'E.
- Steep ascent of bluff.
- 3.30 Top of spur, bears S.60\*W., and N.60\*E., begin descent. +80
- 6.75 A gulch, course S.48\*W., cleared out by loggers, begin ascent of E slope. -60
- 11.75 Change from E slope to ascent of S slope.
- 15.20 Top of spur, bears SW and NE., leave green fir timber, enter burnt timber country. +140
- 17.30 Top of spur, bears E and W; begin steep descent. +40
