

Subdivisions of T. 21 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS

35.50	A gulch, course SE; enter an alderflat, bears E and W.	-200
42.00	A canyon, course NE.	-260
44.25	A canyon, course SE; begin steep ascent.	
48.50	Top of spur, bears NE and SW.	+300
54.00	Top of ridge, bears E and W; descend NW slope, thickly covered by young firs.	+100
65.50	Intersect S bdy. of sec. 29, 19.90 chs. W of cor. to secs. 28 and 29.	

At point of intersection, I set a post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. to secs. 32 and 33, marked C C T 21 S R 11 W on S., S 33 on E., S 32 on W faces, with 1 notch on S and 4 notches on E faces, from which

A vine maple, 4 ins. diam., bears S.57*E., 25 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W S 33 B T.

A vine maple, 4 ins. diam., bears S.66*W., 28 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W S 32 B T.

A spruce, 42 ins. diam., bears N.26*W., 27 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 11 W C C S 32 and 33 B T.

Land, mountainous. 65.50 chs.

Soil, gravelly and stony, 3d and 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, spruce, alder, maple, hemlock, cherry.

Dense undergrowth of salmon, salal, thimbleberries, young firs, alders and cherries. 65.50 chs.

Replace the meander post on right bank of Umpqua river, to fractional secs. 31 and 32, by setting a post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked M C on S face, with T 21 S on N., R 11 W S 32 on S., S 31 on W faces, from which

An alder, 8 ins. diam., bears N.38*E., 71 lks. dist. marked T 21 S R 11 W S 32 M C B T.
