Heavily timbered with spruce, alder and crabapple.

Dense undergrowth of same, willow and tule. 22 chs.

16 miles, 19 chs. and 58 lks. of these lines run over mountainous lands or through timber or dense underbrush.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The greater portion of this township is rough, mountainous and broken.

The timber is mostly burnt, but the ground is covered with a very dense growth of thimbleberry, salmonberry, salal, vine maple, young growth alder, fir, and hemlock, and in the northwestern portion of the township, old growth fir, cedar, spruce and alder timber of fair quality.

There is considerable rich bottom land along Schofield and Dean's Creek, which drain the greater portion of the township and flow into the Umpqua River.

The township South is mountainous generally, but contains some bottom land along Coos River and its tributaries, which drain the greater portion.
