

Coast Meridian, T. 21 S., Rs. 12 & 13 W., as surveyed by Harvey Gordon, Deputy Surveyor, under contract No. 68, dated February 2, 1857.

CHAINS

South, bet. secs. 19 and 24.

Set meander post on shore of the Pacific at 35.50 chs. on line. No means could be employed to establish this cor. conformally to instructions.

4.50 Qr. sec. cor. in loose sand. Set witness post on top of a solid natural mound 20 ft. high, which bears S.39°E., 4.60 chs. dist. Deposited 2 boulders 4x6x8x10.

44.50 To cor. of secs. 24, 25, 19, and 30, deposited $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of charcoal and burnt sticks. Raised mound with trench as per instructions.

South, bet. secs. 25 and 30.

Var. 19°30'E.

Line runs in pond and quicksand, offset W. 14.50

40.00 Qr. sec. cor. is in quicksand.

At 40.00, offset, West 8.17 at 40.00 (opposite Sec. cor.)

Ran West 2.50 chs. and set

80.00 Witness post West 25.17 from true cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36. Deposited a soft sand stone 4x6 ins. No means of making better monument, land all sandy and wet, no timber.

South, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Offset West 25.17 to witness cor. and ran South 80.00 mostly in shallow quicksand.

40.00 Qr. sec. cor. is in quicksand.

80.00 Returned E 25.17 to Tp. cor. Set post cor. of Tps. 21 and 22 S of Rs. 12 and 13 W.

Raised no mound because the sand is wet and cannot be heaped up.
