| | A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.74*W., 51 lks. dist. | |
| 48.10 | Top of a cliff, 250 feet high, nearly perpendicular. A Cedar is in view directly in line, the same stands isolated in a small open space so as to be easily recognized. I set a flag on top of this cliff and then descend by a round-about way to the cedar. At the cedar, I lay off a base, 1.50 chs. W., from which the flag on the cliff bears N.3*49'E., making distance across, 22 chs., 48 lks. | -35 |
| 70;58 | Cedar, 24 ins. diam., enter burn't timber flat. | -260 |
| 79.50 | Leave the same and commence steep descent. | -50 |
