A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S.70 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 21 lks. dist.

A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S.61\*W., 23 lks. dist.

A Fir, 52 ins. diam., bears N.19 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 41 lks. dist.

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.26\*E., 11 lks. dist.

Timber, mostly fir, with a few cedars and laurels.

Land mountainous and third rate.

East on random on line bet. secs. 22 and 27.

40.00 Set temp. qr. sec. post.

June 19th.

79.40 Intersect S 18 lks. of post to cor. of sections 22, 23,  
26 and 27.

S.89\*52\*W., on true line bet. sections 22 and 27.

Ve. 20\*15'E.

Descend south slope, fir timber.

13.50 Commence steep descent.

24.00 Descending a spur, course E and W., very thickly set by  
small firs and laurels.

36.50 Branch, 10 lks. wide, course South, commence ascending.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.62  $\frac{3}{4}$ \*W., 44 lks. dist.

44.50 Continue steep descent
