CHAINS

the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3, marked C C T 22 S R 4 W on S., S 2 on E., and S 3 on W faces, with 2 grooves on E and 4 grooves on W faces, from which

A Hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.47*E., 23 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 4 W S 2 B T.

A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S.65*W., 27 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 4 W S 3 B T.

Cloudy afternoon.

November 11, 1901

thence I run

S.0*1'E., on true line bet. secs. 2 and 3.

Descend mountain slope, covered heavily with timber.

10.00 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course W., 75 ft. below sec. cor., begin ascent.

18.50 County Road to Anlauf, bears E and W., 50 ft. above stream, begin slight descent on bench land.

22.90 A stream, 5 lks. wide, course NW., begin ascent on bench land.

39.54 Set a Yew post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 on W face and 2 on E face, from which

A Cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears N.7*E., 5 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 B T.

A Hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears S.83*W., 40 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 3 B T.

This post is 200 ft. above stream, continue to ascend N slope.

53.00 Top of ridge, bears E and W., 150 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., begin to descend.

60.50 Leave large cedar and fir timber, enter dense undergrowth of small firs and chinquapin, bears E and W.

65.40 A bluff, 20 ft. high, bears E and W., leave dense undergrowth, enter large heavy timber, continue steep descent of SW slope.
