## CHAINS

The land is chiefly covered with a heavy growth of firs and cedars, mixed in spots with more open and more level land of a fair quality; it is well watered.

There are two settlers in sec. 2 and one in sec. 26. A coalmine has been discovered in the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 11.

Resurvey of the line between secs. 3 and 10, T 22 S., R 4 W., W.M., as surveyed by O. F. Thiel, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, dated August 15, 1901, under Special Instructions.

I begin at the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, which is a fir post, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. above ground, marked T 22 S S 2 on NE., R 4 W S 11 on SE., S 10 on SW., S 3 on NW faces, with 5 notches on S and 2 notches on E edges, and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

I run thence

S.89°42'W., bet. secs. 3 and 10.

Descend W slope of mountain, covered heavily with large fir and cedar timber.

4.00 Foot of steep descent, still descending, but more gradually.

5.50 A stream, 3 lks. wide, course SW., continue descent of S slope, covered by fir and cedar timber, and hazel and small fir underbrush.

40.24  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., bears N., 23 lks., is a cedar post, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. above ground, marked as described by the surveyor general, from which

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.32°W., 34 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T., original B T.

A Cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N.10°W., 41 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 3 B T., new B T.

Descend a steep W slope.
