

Resurvey of W. Bdy. of T. 22 S., R. 6 W., W. M.

CHAINS

Dense undergrowth of mountain Balm, Salmon-berry,  
Salal-berry and Hazel.

Mountain land, heavily timbered or covered with  
dense undergrowth, 84.60 chs.      Nov. 25, 1897.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This resurveyed range line extends over a rough  
and mountainous district, covered with a heavy growth of  
timber and underbrush. The timber is chiefly Fir, Cedar,  
Hemlock, Maple, Madrona, and Dogwood; the undergrowth,  
Mountain Balm, Hazel, Thimble-berry, Huckle-berry, Salal-  
berry and poison Oak. The soil is generally 3rd rate.

Resurvey of 5th Standard Parallel South, through  
Ranges 6 and 7 W., Same Deputy and Contract.

During July 25 to 29, 1897, I made examination of the  
5th Standard Parallel South, along the N. Bdrs. of T.  
23 S. Rs. 6 and 7 W., and found the following conditions  
to prevail:

All traces of the Standard cor. of Tp. 23 S., Rs. 6 and 7  
W., referring to sec. 1 and 6; and the standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec.  
cor. on the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T 22 S., R 7 W., were  
entirely wanting.

Therefore, preliminary to beginning the subdivisions of  
these fractional townships, I make a resurvey of all  
those lines necessary to the initiation and the  
closings in the execution thereof:

After prolonged search, I find the standard cor. of  
secs. 1 and 2, T. 23 S., R. 7 W., which is in a  
delapidated condition; bearing trees agree with the  
description furnished by the Surveyor General.

Thence I run
