

## Resurvey of 5th Standard Parallel S., through Rs. 6 and 7 W.

CHAINS

R. 7 W., were originally set to refer to the secs. on the South, but in the case of the standard cor. of secs. 1 and 2, T. 23 S., R. 7 W., the cor. was closed upon from the South, and a closing cor. was established for secs. 1 and 2, T. 23 S., R. 7 W., which I find 5.67 chs. West of this standard cor.; therefore this standard cor. has no reference to the secs. on the South; and as I am instructed to initiate the subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 7 W., from this cor. I set the above described cors. on the S bdy. of T. 22 S., R. 7 W., regularly.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 1st, 2nd and 3rd rates.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, dogwood, and madrona.

Dense undergrowth of mountain balm, fir, hemlock, hazel, willow, poison oak and salal-berry.

Mountainous land, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 73.50 chs.

Resurvey of 5th Standard Parallel, through R. 6 W.,  
Same Deputy and Contract.

During July 25, to 29, 1897, I made a retracement of the 5th Standard Parallel, S along the N bdys. of secs. 3, 4, and 5, T. 23 S., R. 6 W., and could find no trace of any cor. along the whole distance, from the Standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on the N bdy. of sec. 3 to the Standard cor. of secs. 5 and 6.

Therefore, preliminary to commencing the subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 6 W., I make a resurvey of the above enumerated lines, the projection of which is necessary to the closings of these subdivisions:

From the standard cor. of secs. 5 and 6, T. 23 S., R. 6 W., which I reestablished Nov. 24, 1897, I run East, on a blank line, along the N bdy. of T. 23 S.,
