

Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 6 W., W. M.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The part of T. 22 S., R. 6 W., embraced in the foregoing field notes lies in a rough and mountainous country, covered generally with a heavy growth of timber and underbrush.

The soil is 2nd and 3rd rate, through out the entire area except a very narrow strip along a branch of Brush Creek, in sec. 19, which is alluvial, 1st rate.

The timber is fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, madrona, dogwood, alder, yew and ash. The undergrowth consists principally of hazel, vine maple, salal berry, salmon berry, thimbleberry, huckleberry, willow and poison oak.
