

Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 7 W., W. M.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The quality of the land in this Tp., hereby subdivided is not above the common average of such lands. There being good No. 1 land along the creek and its tributaries, also on some of the benches and flats back on the mountains. Second and third rate land is also found among the spurs and brakes of the mountains.

There is but very little impediment to the navigation of Elk creek up to the Eastern boundary of the Tp. and above, during the fall, winter and spring months.

Many of the creeks in this tp. are of sufficient importance to furnish good mill sites.

Settlements are made in secs. 12, 16, 17, 33 and 34. The fire raging in the (SW) NW portion of the township, has been doing havock with the timber and keeps it so smokey that it is difficult to run a line, and can have no idea of the features of the country until it is passed over.

East Boundary of T. 22 S., R. 8 W., W. M., as surveyed by W. H. Byars, Deputy Surveyor, under his Contract No. 376 dated January 22, 1881.
