CHAINS	
	This cor. is on the NW. slope of ridge, 25 ft. above spur.
59.00	Top of ridge, bears N.20°E., and S.20°W., 300 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor.; descend.
62.00	Spur, slopes SE., 30 ft. below top of ridge.
82.13	The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10, 450 ft. below top of ridge.
	Land, mountainous.
	Soil, 3rd rate.
	Timber, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Maple, Chinquapin and Dogwood.
	Dense undergrowth of Hazel, Ocean spray, Salmon-berry, Thimble-berry and Huckle-berry.
	Mountainous land, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 82.13 chs. Dec. 4, 1897.
	From the cor. of Secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, which is a post, 4 ins. sq., 12 ins. above ground, mkd. and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, I run S.89°37'E., on a random line, bet. secs. 4 and 9.
	Mag. decl. 20°30'E.
40.00	Set a temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor.
75.82	Intersect N. and S. line, 28 lks. S. of the cor. of Secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10; thence, I run N.89°49'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 4 and 9.
	Descend.
2.00	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S.70°E., 25 ft. below Sec. Cor.; ascend ridge.
15.25	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., 250 ft. above last creek; trail lies along top of ridge; descend.
35.45	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.70°W., 200 ft. below top of ridge; thence, along Southerly slope of mountain.
40.00	Set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face; from which A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.75°E., 13 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
