A Cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S.80°30'E., 41 lks. dist.
Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 2 B. T.

A Hemlock, 26 ins. diam., bears S.53°W., 85 lks. dist.
Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 3 B. T.

A Hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.79°W., 23 lks. dist.
Marked T. 21 S., R. 9 W., S. 34 B. T.

S.6°W., on true line, between secs. 2 and 3.
