CHAINS

Set Fir post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked F. S. 9 on the E, and F. S. 8 on the W. faces, from which,

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.8*E., 35 lks. dist.

Marks grown over.

A Fir (stump), 36 ins. diam., bears S.34 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 35 lks. dist.

The SE. corner of the D. L. claim of Edward Spicer, bears N.54*W., 134 lks. dist., thence, I ran, South, between secs. 8 and 9.

27.00 Set Fir post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, for corner to secs. 8, 9, 16, 17, marked T. 22 22 S., S. 9 on the NE., R. 9 W., S. 16, on the SE., S. 17, on the SW., and S 8 on the NW., faces with 4 notches on the S. and E. edges, from which,

An Oak, 7 ins. diam., bears N.40*E., 58 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W. S. 9 B. T.

An Oak, 7 ins. diam., bears S.66*E., 125 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 16 B. T.

An Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears S.73*W., 203 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 17 B. T.

An Oak, 7 ins. diam., bears N.35*W., 213 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 8 B. T.

Thence, I run,

East, on true line, between secs. 9 and 16.

Va. 20*E.

17.50 To the corner of fractional corner to secs. 9 and 16., old post had been destroyed.

Set Fir post, 5 feet long, 6 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, marked S. 9 on N. and T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 16 on S. faces, from which,

A Fir (stump), 30 ins. diam., bears N.29*E., 115 lks. dist.

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.32*W., 292 lks. dist.

Marks grown over.
