85.24	Intersected N. and S. line, 3.90 chs. S. of the corner to secs. 5 and 8. Set Fir post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground on hillside sloping SW. for closing corner to secs. 5 and 8, marked T. 22 S., S 5 on the N., C. C. on the E. R. 9 W., S. 8 on the S. sides, with 5 grooves on the S. and E. sides, from which, An Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears N.67*E., 69 lks. dist. Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 5 B. T. A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.52*E., 23 lks. dist. Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 8 B. T. A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.82*W., 25 lks. dist. Marked C. C. T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 5-8 B. T. Land, mountainous, 85.24 chs. Soil, second and third rate. Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Maple, Chinquapin, Madrone, and Alder. Undergrowth, dense Rhododendron, vine-Maple, Huckleberry, Salalberry, Salmonberry, Hazel, Thimbleberry, Fir, and Hemlock. 84.24 chs.
