Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

A Chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears N.23*E., 25 lks. dist.
Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 7 B. T.

A Chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears S.59*30'E., 12 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 18 B. T.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.81*W., 33 lks. dist.

Marked C. C. T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 7-18 B. T.

Va. 20*E.

Land, mountainous West of river, 72.22 chs., East of river level.

Soil, first and second rate.

Timber, Fir, Alder and Maple.

Undergrowth, dense Hazel, Thimbleberry, vine-Maple,

Rhododendron, Salmonberry, and Salalberry. 90.64 chs.

October 20 1894.

Commenced again at the corner to secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18,

Thence, I run, Va. 20*E.

North, between secs. 7 and 8, along a blazed line.

6.00 Ascend.

10.00 Top of bench.

16.00 Entered swamp.

22.50 Leave swamp.

31.50 Descend from bench.

33.30 To the left bank of the Umpqua river. Could not find any evidence of meander corner.

I set flag at this point, thence over river and on line, between secs. 7 and 8, at the margin of water on right bank, to obtain distance across river, I run S.65*W., 250 lks., Lat of this line, 106 lks. Departure 2.26 chs. (base 2.26 chs.)

I find the flag bears S.17*55'E., which gives nat. cot. 17*55' x base or 3.0929 x 2.26 = 69899 to which add Lat. 1.06 = 8.05 chs. across river. Add the distance
