

Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.80*W., 36 lks. dist.
 Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 35 B. T.

I marked a Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.66*W., 270 lks. dist.
 Marked T. 23 S., R. 9 W., S. 2 B. T.

And destroyed marks on B. T. in secs. 35 and 36.

The description of this corner agrees with notes furnished me.

Set Hemlock post, 4½ feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground at point of intersection for closing corner to secs. 35 and 36, marked C. C. on the N., T. 22 S. S. 36 on the E., and R. 9 W., S. 35 on the W. sides with 1 groove on the E., and 5 grooves on the W. sides, from which,

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.44*E., 58 lks. dist.
 Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 36 B. T.

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.37*E., 27 lks. dist.
 Marked C. C. T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 35-36 B. T.

A Fir 36 ins. diam., bears N.58*W., 45 lks. dist.
 Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 35 B. T.

Land mountainous. 73.40 chs.

Soil, first and second rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Maple and Alder.

Undergrowth, dense vine-Maple, Rododendron, Hazel, Huckle, Thimble, and Salalberry and Arrow wood. 73.40 chs.

Commenced at the corner to secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27, which is a granite stone, 10 x 8 x 4 ins. above ground, marked with 2 notches on the S. and E. sides,
