8.00	A creek, 1 lk. wide, Course SE. Ascend.	
20.00	Top of ridge, Course N. and S. Descend.	
37.90	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner, which is a Hemlock, 10 ins. diam., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on the South side, from which, A W. Fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N.40°E., 41 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B. T. A Maple, 24 ins. diam., bears S.20°W., 54 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B. T. Agreeing in part with notes furnished me by the U. S. Surveyor General. Continued S.89°33'E., from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner. Ascend.

79.65	To a point 2.38 chs. North of the corner to secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, whole length of line 79.65 chs. True course from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner to secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, is S.86°23'E. Land, mountainous. 79.65 chs. Soil, second rate. Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Maple. Undergrowth, dense, vine-Maple, Hazel, Fir, Hemlock and Rhododendron.
