CHAINS

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. B. T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.18*W., 35 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. B. T.

Continued N.89*29'E., from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner.

57.20 A creek, 6 lks. wide, Course NE.

Pass over spur.

67.25 Trail, Course NE. and SW.

72.10 A creek, 15 lks. wide, Course N.

82.45 To a point, 15 lks. S. of the corner to secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, which I re-established, as follows:

Set a Fir post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in ground on hillside sloping West, marked T. 22 S., S. 24 on the NE., R. 9 W., S 25 on the SE., S. 26 on the SW. and S. 23 on the NW. faces with 2 notches on the S., and 1 notch on the E. edges, from which,

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.54*E., 67 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 24 B. T.

An Alder, (stump), bears S.77*E., 25 lks. dist.

An Alder, 12 ins. diam., bears S.28*W., 60 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 26 B. T.

An Alder, 8 ins. diam., bears N.82*W., 37 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 23 B. T.

I marked,

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.50*E., 47 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 25 B. T.

Land, mountainous. 82.45 chs.

Soil, second rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Alder and Maple.

Undergrowth, dense, vine-Maple, Hazel, Fir and Hemlock.
