

Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

on the NW. faces, with 4 notches on the S. and 2 notches on the E. edges, from which,

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.45*E., 200 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 11 B. T.

A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S.76*E., 39 lks. dist.

Marked (in the bark) T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 14 B. T.

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.48*30'W., 221 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 15 B. T.

A W. Oak, 15 ins. diam., bears N.42*W., 232 lks. dist.

Marked T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 10 B. T.

Practically agreeing with notes from the U. S. Surveyor General's.

Land, mountainous. 82.71 chs.

Soil, second rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Maple and Scattering Oak.

Undergrowth, dense, Fir, Oak, vine-Maple, and Hazel.

82.71 chs.

March 29, 1895.

From the corner to secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

I ran thence, North between secs. 10 and 11.

Va. 20*E.

Ascend.

8.00 Top of ridge, Course E. and W.

18.90 A creek, 1 lk. wide, Course W.

Pass over spur.

21.00 A creek, 2 lks. wide, Course W.

42.55 To a point, 15 lks. West of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner.

Commenced at the corner to secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21.

Thence, I run, East, between secs. 16 and 21.

Va. 19*30'E.

8.10 A creek, 1 lk. wide, Course S.75*W.
