

Resurvey of Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS		
	Thence through grain field.	
21.00	John Frazer's house bears North 3.50 chs. The barn bears N.40*E., about 5.00 chs. dist.	
24.84	To the right bank of the Umpqua river. Old corner destroyed, I set Willow post, 5 feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, for corner to fractional secs. 8 and 17, marked M. C. on its West face, T. 22 S., on the E., R. 9 W., S. 8 on the N. and S. 17 on the S. sides, from which, A Willow, 14 ins. diam., bears N.55*W., 21 lks. dist. Marks grown over. I marked, An Alder, 4 ins. diam., bears S. 18*E., 32 lks. dist. Mark M. C. T. 22 S., R. 9 W., S. 17 B. T. Commenced again at the corner to secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18. Thence, I run, East, between secs. 7 and 18. Va. 20*E.	
5.00	Began to ascend.	
20.00	Top of spur sloping North. Descend.	+400
41.20	The left bank of the Umpqua river. After diligent search, could not find old meander corner. Set Willow post, 5 feet long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for corner to fractional corner to secs. 17 and 8, marked M. C. on the E. T. 22 S., on the W. R. 9 W., S. 8 on the N., and S. 17 on the S. faces. Dug pit, 3 feet square, 18 ins. deep, 8 lks. West of post and raised mound of earth, 30 ins. high and 5 feet around post. I set flag at meander post on right bank of river. When I find the flag bears from this corner N.69*E., I then	-400
