CHAINS	West, on true line between secs. 14 & 23. Var. 18½* East.	
6.00	Top of spur, course S.	+ 50
14.00	Enter bottom, course NW. & SE.	-200
19.24	Intersect river. Set meander post--witness cor. Marked willow, 8 ins. diam., for cor. from which A willow, 7 ins. diam., bears N.30*E. dist. 3 lks. A cottonwood, 8 ins. diam., bears S.15*E. dist. 40 lks. Across river. Base, S.38*E. 5.00 chs. N.73*W. to flag. Angle opposite 17*, across 9.81	
29.05	Opposite bank.	
29.25	Set post, from which An alder, 6 ins. diam., bears S.40*E. dist. 18 lks. An alder, 6 ins. diam., bears N.2*W. dist. 15 lks.	
30.50	Steep mountain. Land, 1st part, 2nd rate. River bottoms, 1st rate. Timber, same as preceding line, 2nd rate.

S.61 3/4*W.	16.20	Intersect--Meander post bet. secs. 13 & 24. Land, 1st rate. Timber, maple & myrtle. Banks high.
