40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

76.40 Intersect N. & S. line 45 lks. N. of cor. to secs. 23, 24, 25 & 26, which is a stone 28x14x3 ins. set in the ground, from which

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.88*E. 43 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 10 W S 24 B T.

This cor. is on top of a bluff of sandstone 40 ft. high facing SW.

Thence I run

N.89*42'W. a true line bet. secs. 23 & 26.

Var. 20*30'E.

Descend steep.

Thence along S. slope.

30.00 A spur, course SW. -300 below starting pt.

40.00 On top of a bluff 100 ft. high, a fir on line, 8 ins. diam., which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on W. face for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., from which
