40.00 I here made diligent search for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. but failed to
find any. I therefore set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.60 The established cor. to secs. 25, 26, 35 & 36 bears E.
4.25 chs. I found no marks or blazes along this line.
I therefore go to the cor. to secs. 25, 26, 35 & 36 &
run a new line.

N. $3^{\circ}4'W$. a true line bet. secs. 25 & 26.

Var. $20^{\circ}30'E$.

29.60 Ridge, course S. $70^{\circ}W$.

Descend along W. slope.

35.20 Spur, course N. $15^{\circ}W$.

Descend.

39.80 I again make diligent search for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. & failing to
find any, I therefore marked a maple on line, 4 ins.
diam., $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on W. face for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., from which

A maple, 4 ins. diam., bears S. $60^{\circ}E$. 2 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A maple, 4 ins. diam., bears S. $18^{\circ}W$. 2 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

50.00 A dry creek, 6 lks., course S. $70^{\circ}W$.

Ascend.

73.00 Divide, course S. $70^{\circ}W$.

79.45 Foot of bluff, 50 ft. high.

79.60 The cor. to secs. 23, 24, 25 & 26.

Land, mountainous, 79.60 chs.

Soil, 4th rate, rocky.
