marked T 22 S R 10 W S 6 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S10\*E. 80 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 10 W S 7 B T.

A laurel (arbutus), 3 ins. diam., bears S.43\*W.  
marked T 22 S R 10 W S 6 & 7 C C B T.

Land, mountainous, 50.53 chs.

Dense undergrowth of crab apple, willow, ninebark, thimble-  
berry, vine maple, sallal, manzanita & tar balm, 50.53  
chs.

Soil, good in bottom, 1st rate 8 chs. Remainder, 3rd &
