CHAINS

At this cor. of secs. 1 and 2, on the N. bdy. of the Tp. heretofore described.

Thence I run

West, on a blank line along the N. bdy. of sec. 2.

26.00

At this point I make diligent search for the old cor. of secs. 35 and 36, established under Contract No. 292 but can find no trace of it.

31.55

Intersect the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 22 S., R. 10 W. which is a post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
