CHAINS

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.30*E. dist. 48 lks.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.8*W. dist. 39 lks.

Land, high, broken, 3rd rate.

Timber burned down and chiefly fir.

Underbrush, same, vine maple, alder, huckle, thimble,
salmon and blackberry vines.

General Description

This township (fractional) was surveyed upon the application and special deposit of John McIsacks, who sought for the survey of the lands covered by his preemption. Owing to the fractional condition of the western tier of secs. it became necessary to extend the lines $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east and the same distance south from the cor. to secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.

The survey as here made **covers** all lands valuable in the four sections and for several adjoining to the east and south so far as I can judge from appearances and information gathered from old residents.

As the survey here made exceeds the limits of the contract (viz. No. 315) I hereby relinquish all claims against the government for any excess of distance run by me.

The lands covered by this survey are very inferior excepting a narrow valley along the creek which is first class.

The timber on the hills has nearly all been consumed or killed by fires many years ago and now these hills are covered with brush, etc. as described in the notes and are of little or no value.

Two settlers are located in this survey with good houses and other permanent improvements--orchards, etc.
