## North Boundary of T. 23 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS

I surveyed no farther east for the reason that the land beyond this is of no value: it is a rough mountain country and has been burnt over until the timber is all dead, except the undergrowth or sprout timber.

This line so far is densely covered with forests of dead fir and green maple, myrtle and alder timber and thick undergrowth of thimbleberry, huckleberry and briars.

Soil in bottom, 1st rate; on hills, 3rd rate.

Exterior Boundaries of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

I begin at the witness cor. to secs. 13 & 24 on E. bdy. of T. 22 S., R. 12 W. which is a mound of stone, from which

A maple, 30 ins. diam., bears N.20\*W. 187 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 12 W W C S 24 B T.

The other B. T. which is described as an alder, 12 ins. diam., N.35\*E. 144 lks. from cor. is gone.

From the cor. I run

South, on a true line on E. bdy. of sec. 13.

Var. 19\*30'E.

Ascend over bluff, 8 ft. high,

1.00 Set a stone 16x12x8 ins. 10 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 13 & 24, marked with 3 notches in the N. and S. edges, from which

A cherry, 16 ins. diam., bears S.57\*W. 51 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 12 W S 24 B T.

A spruce, 8 ins. diam., bears N.4\*W. 25 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 12 W S 13 B T.

An alder, 20 ins. diam., bears S.47\*E. 16 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 12 W S 13 & 24 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, alder, cherry & spruce, 1 ch.
