

Exterior Boundaries of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS	
82.20	Cattle trail, course S.60*E. and N.60*W. Ascend
87.00	Top of a little spur, course NE. about 200 ft. above dry creek.
89.00	Gulch, course E. Ascend.
90.65	Intersect S. bdy. of Tp. at a point 4.80 chs. W. of the cor. of Tps. 23 S., Rs. 11 and 12 W. at which point I set a stone, 24x12x6 ins., 16 ins. in the ground for closing cor. to Tps. 22 S., Rs. 11 and 12 W., marked with 6 notches on the N., E., & W. sides, from which A dead cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.54*E. 18 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 11 W S 31 B T. A cedar stub, 24 ins. diam., bears N.85 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W. 118 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 36 B T. A fir stub, 36 ins. diam., bears S.71*E. 69 lks. dist. marked C C T 22 S R 11 & 12 B T.  Land, mountainous, 90.65 chs. Soil, 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered with fir, maple, alder and cedar. Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, vine maple, salmon- berry, sallal, and briars.  June 5, 1894.

South Boundary

I began at the cor. to secs. 5 & 6 on the N. bdy. of  
T. 23 S., R. 11 W.  
The old post being gone I reestablished the cor. by  
setting a stone, 14x12x6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground  
marked with 1 notch on the W. and 5 notches on the  
E. edges, from which
