Exterior Boundaries of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS	Underbrush, dense growth of thimbleberry, salmonberry, sallal and briars, 80 chs.
	June 7, 1894.
	Thence East, on a true line on N. bdy. of sec. 1. Var. 19*40'E.
16.20	Descend. Stream, 20 lks. wide, course S.30*W. 300 ft. below cor. Ascend.
24.66	A fir, 40 ins. diam., marked with 2 notches on E. & W. sides on top of spur, course NW. about 250 ft. above creek and descend gradually.
33.25	Dry creek bed, 3 lks. wide, course NW. about 100 ft. below top of spur. Ascend.
40.00	A point about 280 ft. above dry creek bed. Set a stone 17x12x6 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which A burnt fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N.20*E. 38 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A burnt fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.41*W. 31 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. Var. 20*E.
46.00	Top of a spur, course N.60*W. about 175 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Thence over N. slope, descending.
49.37	Set a temp. Tp. cor. for the SE. cor. to T. 22 S., R. 11 W. Note: The East boundary of T. 22 S., R. 11 W. is to be run south, and the SE. cor. to said Tp. will be established at the point of intersection of the East and South boundaries of the same.
	Land, mountainous, 49.37 chs. Soil, 3rd & 4th rate.
