71.15 Stream, 4 lks. wide, course E. about 600 ft. below last spur.

Ascend abruptly.

80.00 This point falling on a flat rock in place, I marked a cross (x) at exact cor. point for cor. to secs. 13, 18, 19 & 24 with 3 notches on S. and 3 notches on N. sides, from which

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.42\*E. 58 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 10 W S 19 B T.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.81\*W . 6 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W S 24 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.64\*W. 10 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W S 13 B T.

Land, 80.00 chs. mountainous.

Soil, 3rd & 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and maple.

Dense undergrowth of alder, huckleberry and thimbleberry.
