East Boundary of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS

58.75 Summit of dividing ridge between the Umpqua and Coos Rivers, with trail on top, course E. & W. about 300 ft. above gulch.

65.98 A fir, 8 ins. diam. which I mark with 2 notches on N. & S. sides.

67.00 Descend E. slope.

79.00 Stream, 2 lks. wide, course SE. about 300 ft. below top of divide.

80.00 Set a stone 18x12x8 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for cor. to sec. 25, 30, 31 & 36, marked with 5 notches on N. and 1 notch on S. edges, from which

An alder, 12 ins. diam., bears N.26*E. 41 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 10 W S 30 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.4*E. 59 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 10 W S 31 B T.

A burnt fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S.59*W. 167 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W S 36 B T.

An alder, 10 ins. diam., bears N.41*W. 36 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W S 25 B T.

Land, mountainous, 80.00 chs.

Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and maple.

Dense undergrowth of huckleberry, alder, thimbleberry and sallal.

Soil, 3rd rate.

July 17, 1894.

Thence South on a true line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Var. 20*10'E.

Over E. slope, descending.

6.50 Burnt fir, 60 ins. diam. marked with 2 notches on N. & S. sides.

9.25 A gulch, course E.

19.30 A stream, 7 lks. wide, course SW. about 200 ft. below sec. cor.

Ascend abruptly.
