

Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.43°E. 68 lks. dist.
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 11 & 12 B T.

Land, mountainous and broken.

Soil, 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with alder and scattering fir with a
very dense undergrowth of alder, thimbleberry, sallal,
huckleberry & salmonberry.

Dec. 15, 1894.

West, on N. bdy. sec. 11

Var. 20°05'E.

Ascend abruptly through timber.

10.60 Top of a ridge, course N. about 450 ft. above sec. cor.
and descend.

24.00 A dry creek bed, 1 lk. wide, course N. about 300 ft.
below top of ridge & ascend.

33.00 Summit of mountain, course NW. & SE. about 400 ft. above
last dry creek bed and descend.

40.00 A stone in place 10x5x1 ft. above ground which I mark
with a cross (x) at exact cor. point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
with $\frac{1}{4}$ N. of cross.

No trees in limits.

A stone 24x24x18 ins. above ground bears S. 14 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ B \emptyset .

Built a mound of earth $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base alongside.
Pits impracticable.

48.30 Bottom of a gulch, course SW. about 500 ft. below top
of mountain.

Continue over broken W. slope.

58.00 Bottom of a gulch, course S.30°W.

70.46 Stream, 1 lk. wide, course S. and ascend.

76.80 Top of a spur, course S. about 300 ft. high.

Continue over S. slope ascending to
