

## Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS	Thence along N. slope.
54.25	Top of a ridge, slope NW. Descend.
71.50	A dry creek bed, 5 lks. wide, course N.20*W. about 600 ft. below last ridge. Ascend.
77.00	Top of a spur, on N. slope about 100 ft. above creek. Descend.
80.48	A point 100 ft. below top of last spur and the cor. to secs. 11, 12, 13 & 14. Land, mountainous, 80.48 chs. Soil, 4th rate. Timber, mostly young, heavy growth of fir & alder. Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, salmonberry, vine maple and sallal, 80.48 chs.  July 20, 1894.
	Thence West on a random line bet. secs. 11 & 14. Var. 20*05'E.
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.
84.00	Intersect N. & S. line at cor. to secs. 10, 11, 14 & 15, which is a stone 10x6x2 ins., above mound, with 4 notches on S. and 2 notches on E. edges, with a mound of stone, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, 2 ft. base around stone. Thence I run East, on a true line on S. bdy. of sec. 11. Var. 20*E. Ascend.
4.00	Top of a ridge sloping SW. about 150 ft. above cor. Set a stone 16x12x10 ins. in mound of stone $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, with 2 ft. base for cor. to secs. 14 & 15 with 4 notches on S. and 2 notches on E. faces. No trees in limits. Too rocky to set a stone in ground.
