	Thence East, on a true line bet. secs. 11 & 14.
	Var. 20°E.
5.00	Bottom of a gulch, course S.20°W. about 150 ft. below sec. cor.
	Ascend.
16.00	Summit of a high ridge, course N. & S. about 200 ft. above gulch.
	Descend.
24.50	Bottom of a ravine, course NE. about 300 ft. below top of ridge.
	Ascend about 50 ft., then descend along N. slope.
40.00	An alder, 15 ins. diam. which I marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S. on N. side for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., from which
	A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S.45°W. 37 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
	An alder, 14 ins. diam., bears N.45°E. 31 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
40.85	A dry creek bed, 6 lks. wide, course N. about 650 ft. below top of last ridge.
	Ascend.
66.00	Summit of ridge, course N. & S. about 600 ft. above dry creek, a hunters trail on top.

71.25	Top of a little spur, course NE. Descend abruptly.
79.00	Bottom of a gulch, course NE. about 400 ft. below top of last spur.
	Ascend.

	Land, mountainous, 84 chs.
	Soil, 3rd & 4th rate.
	Heavily timbered with fir, alder and cedar, mostly young growth.
	Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, mountain balm, willow, cherry & sallal, 84 chs.
