CHAINS	
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. .
79.90	Intersect E. bdy. of T. 34 lks. N. of cor. to secs. 19, 24, 25 & 30. Thence N.89*50'W. on a true line bet. secs. 24 & 25. Var. 20*10'E. Ascend.
7.25	Top of a mountain, course N. & S. about 300 ft. above the sec. cor. trail on top. Descend.
32.67.	Var. 20*40'E.
38.00	A stream, 1 lk. wide, course N.10*W. about 600 ft. below top of mountain. Ascend N. slope.
39.95	This point falling on smooth bed rock, I marked a cross (x) at exact cor. point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with $\frac{1}{4}$ marked N. of cross (x)., from which A maple, 10 ins. diam., bears N.85*W. 9 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.39*E. 41 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
42.80	Top of a spur, course N. about 100 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Descend.
45.25	A dry creek bed, 4 lks. wide, course N.
58.00	Top of a high ridge, course N. & S. about 500 ft. above dry creek. Descend.
79.90	The cor. to secs. 23, 24, 25 & 26. Land, 79.90 chs. mountainous. Soil, 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered with young growth of fir, alder and maple. Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, greasewood, mountain balm and briars, 79.90 chs.
	Thence S.0*1'E. bet. secs. 25 & 26.
