63.75	<p>A stream, 7 lks. wide, course W. about 375 ft. below top of last ridge, Ascend.</p>
68.20	<p>Intersect S. bdy. of T. 9.00 chs. E. of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on N. bdy. of sec. 3, T. 23 S., R. 11 W. At which point I set a post, 4 ft. long and 4 ins.sq., 2 ft. in the ground for closing cor. to secs. 34 & 35, marked C C T 22 S R 11 W on N., S 35 on E. and S 34 on W. faces with 2 notches on E. and 4 notches on W. sides, from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">An alder, 4 ins. diam., bears N.72*E. 16 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W S 35 B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">An alder, 4 ins. diam., bears N.21*W. 15 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W S 34 B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">An alder, 4 ins. diam., bears S.44*W. 20 lks. dist. marked T 22 S R 11 W C C S 34 & 35 B T.</p> <p>Land, 68.20 chs. mountainous.
